This supports the findings of Cahyono (2008) that most English teachers ignore vocabulary words because they focus on the four English skills. In addition, limited time and practice in learning vocabulary are often the main reasons students do not know how to master their vocabulary.

The MALL concept is the use of the capabilities of mobile devices as assistants in the language teaching and learning (LTL) process of teachers and students. The portable model makes it easy for teachers to carry out ELT activities both inside and outside the classroom. They can also create and share simple educational materials using tools such as photos, videos, text or recordings (Hulme, Noris, & Jim, 2015). In addition, according to Fithriani (2019), the use of MALL centers can be a solution to overcome time and place limitations in participating in teaching and learning activities. Moreover, mobile devices are indispensable tools that support people in their daily activities.

Especially in solving vocabulary mastery problems, one of the applications currently being researched is the HE application. Rahmawati, Hasanah and Puspitaloka, (2017) found that the application of HE contributed positively to students' vocabulary mastery competence. Their scores increased greatly after the HE application was implemented. Furthermore, student participation in class looks active because each is involved in the learning process. Therefore, researchers consider that the HE application offers a fun teaching alternative to support teachers in creating creative learning methods. At the same time, Vasselinov and Grego (2017) found that Hello English was also effective for students' oral skills. They studied students in grades 8 through 12 and found substantial progress between students who used the app and students who didn't. The confidence interval is between 60% and 83%.
